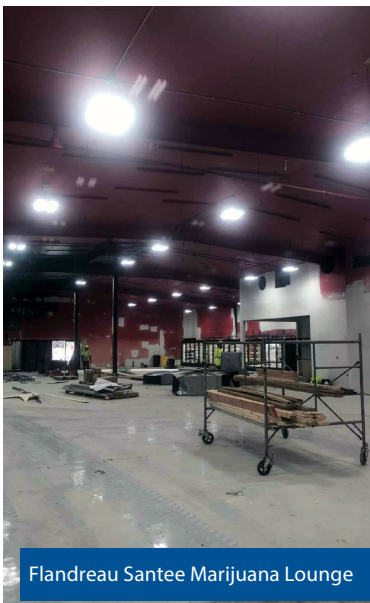

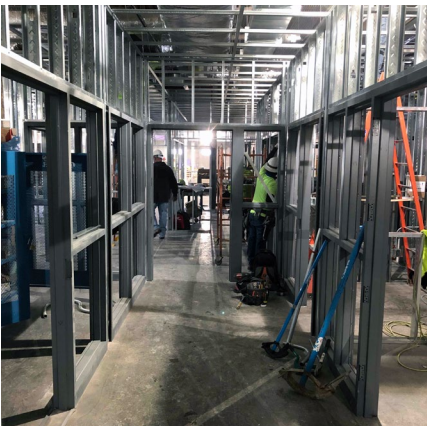

Sanford Health Van Demark Building Update

Project Expeditor Brenda Laue gives an update for the Sanford Health Van De Mark project.

At the Sanford Health Van De-mark Expansion, the tower crane and material/manlift have been erected. Structural steel erection is underway by HCC and will continue through the month of January. There is also some miscellaneous work being done inside the existing building, but the majority of that work is mechanical.



South Dakota State Penitentiary Jameson Annex Medical Expansion Update

Field Engineer Keaton Bohnenkamp gives us an update for the South Dakota State Penitentiary Jameson Annex Medical Expansion project.

The interior is starting to fill in fast. MEP contractors have finished running nearly all of the above-ceiling work and are wrapping up insulating and are making slight adjustments. All of the interior framing has just been completed which has allowed for all rough-ins and blocking to start.

Exterior window frames have just been installed and will be receiving security glazing within the week.

Sheetrock is the next task that will begin shortly and will be ongoing for about a month. Once sheetrock is hung, taped and finished, we may proceed with painting, casework and MEP trim-out.

First PREMIER Bank Corporate Office Update

Field Engineer Matt Kolbeck provides an update for the First PREMIER Bank project.

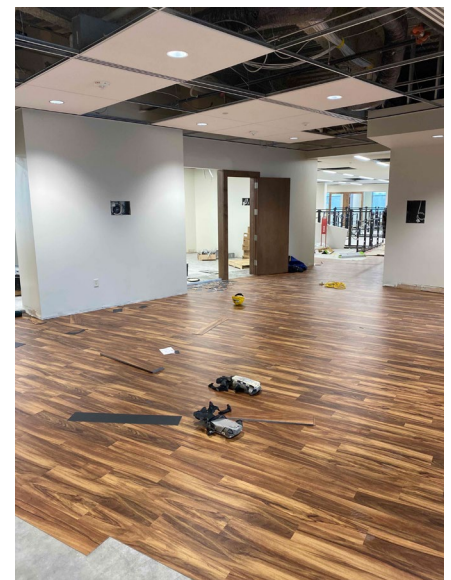


At First PREMIER Bank, we are in the final stages of construction. On the exterior, the metal panels will be complete by weeks end and then metal cap is to be installed. Electric Supply will be installing the last of their "Halo" light once the metal panels are complete.

On the inside, a lot of activities are currently in progress. Flooring is complete down to second floor and Syverson Tile is moving along with their large format tile install in the lobby on first floor. A few owner item installations have started, including the Daktronics board in the lobby and office furniture on the south end of

the building. HCC carpenters are staying busy trimming out wood doors, sills and base. Bathroom accessories and door hardware are ongoing.

The punch list with the architect will begin in February. The First PREMIER Bank team plans to start a phased move-in during the early weeks of March.

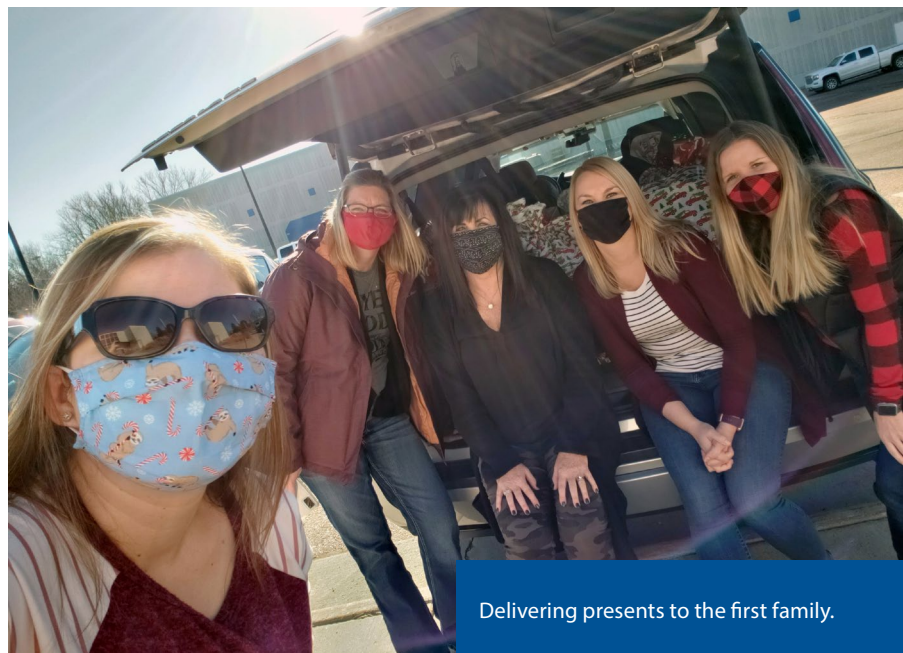
GIVING BACK

If your school only mails transcripts, please email NFSF (nfsf@nawic.org) for the address to mail the transcripts to. Official sealed transcripts must also be received no later than February 28th. **THIS DEADLINE IS STRICTLY ENFORCED.**
- Only students enrolled in a school in the United States will be considered for awards.

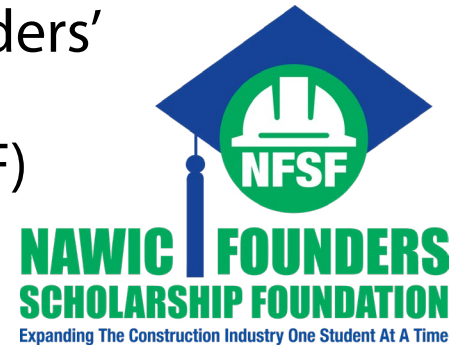
The NAWIC Founders' Scholarship Foundation (NFSF)

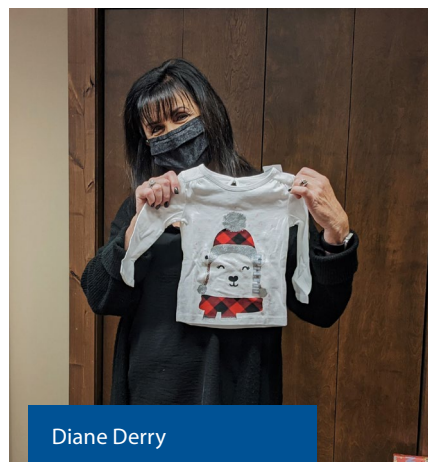

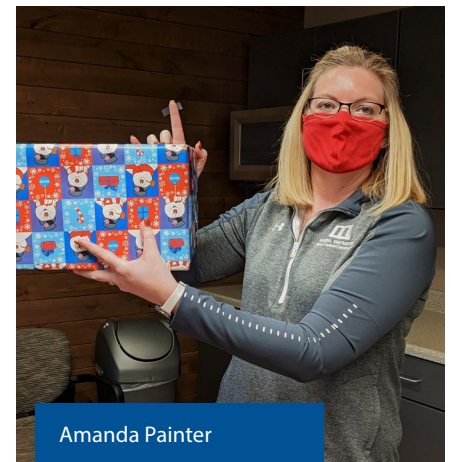
