



Spencer Quarries: The construction on the primary crushing tower for Spencer Quarries is ongoing. They just set the last feeder unit this week and are working on the rest of the structure. The footings and foundations are complete for the rest of the project. We are waiting on the arrival of the steel for the second tower, so the second crew can start. We are expecting the project to complete June 2018.





SDSU Stanley J. Marshall Center: We are finishing work on the concrete foundations and backfilling. Steel erection started February 12th. About a third of the building is up to date. The 96 foot trusses came on a turn bed truck in one piece, which was impressive to see such a large truck load. The steel crew should be done within the next two to three weeks.

Work on the Performing Arts Center is expected to complete in October. Architecture Incorporated is the architect.








Henry Carlson ConstructionNew Positions


Two Henry Carlson Construction employees have new roles with the company. Chris Schoffelman has been promoted to Superintendent. Chris has been with the company for 18 years.

9. What is the first thing you would buy if you won the lottery?


Pay off debt for myself and my family, then use what's left to buy an acreage somewhere in the mountains away from a big city.

A Piece of History

During her office organizing, Brenda Laue found an historic wage rate sheet from the Crippled Children's Hospital & School Rehabilitation and Nursing Wings project from 1956.

Children's Care Hospital & School opened in 1952 as the private, non-profit "Crippled Children's Hospital & School," a citizens' grass roots effort to provide rehabilitation and education to children recovering from polio. Until then, children often never returned to school after recovering from the acute phase of their illness, as buildings were seldom accessible.
