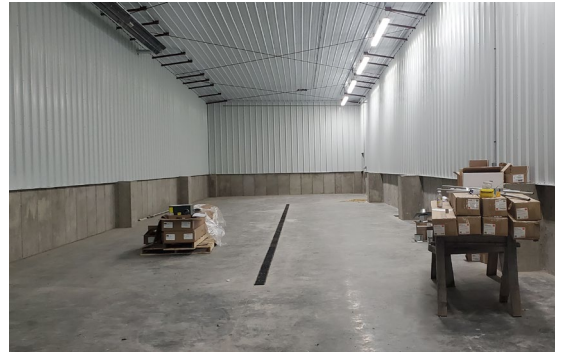

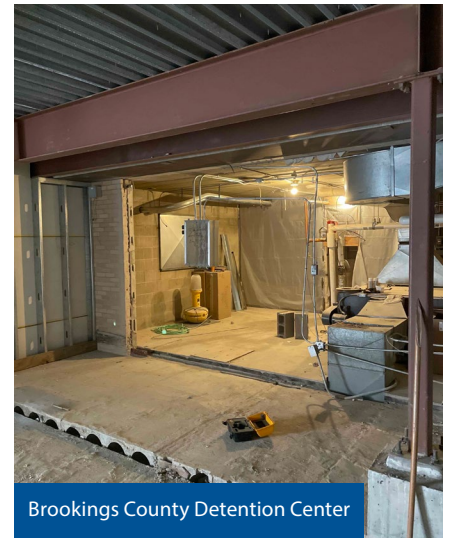

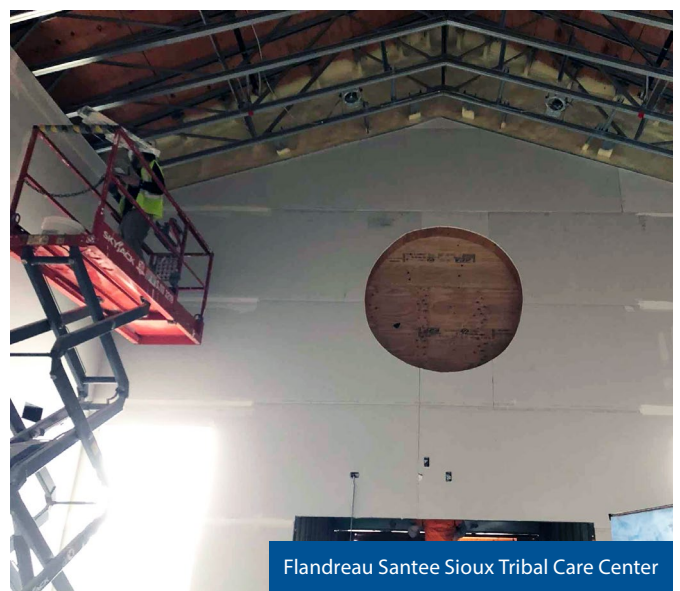

Jeremy said, "She will be missed by all of us here at Sanford in-house, as she has always been a reliable and hard worker."

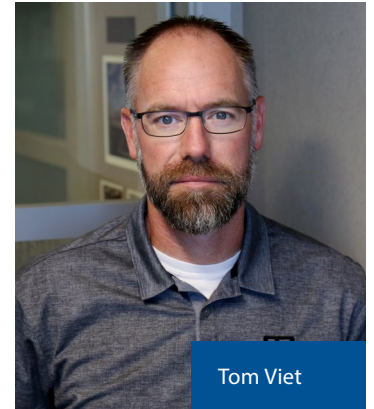
