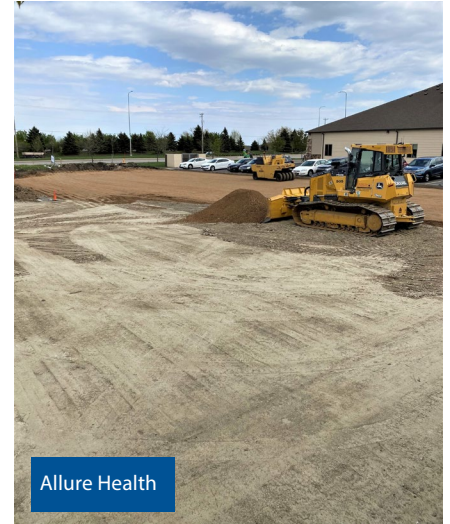

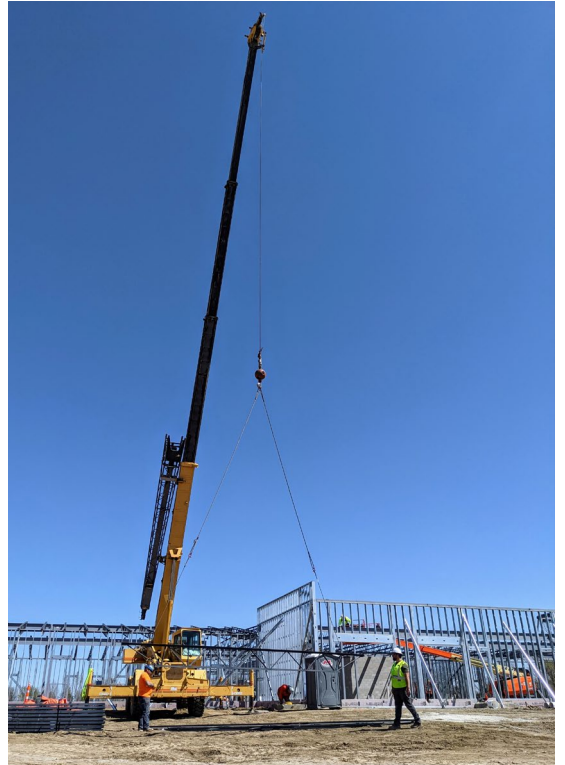

Sanford Health Van Demark Building Update

Project Expeditor Brenda Laue gives an update for the Sanford Health Van Demark project.

Work on the exterior wall construction to enclose the Sanford Health Van Demark Expansion continues and roof and window installation are scheduled to begin in June. In addition, crews have started the first phase of the remodel work in the existing building. A three-hour rated wall will be constructed in the lower level. The wall will have two accordion fire doors activated by the fire alarm system and four borrowed lites. To maintain the fire rating, each borrowed lite will have three panes of one inch glass and structural metal framing will be installed to accommodate for the extra weight of these borrowed lites.



South Dakota State Penitentiary Jameson Annex Medical Expansion Update

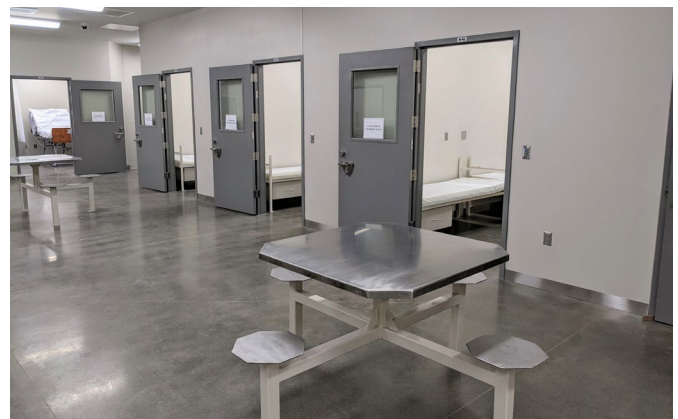
Field Engineer Keaton Bohnenkamp provides an update for the Jameson Annex project.

Phase 1 of the Jameson Annex project is complete and occupied. A few punch list items are getting touched up in phase 1, but other than that, we are in full swing with demo for the phase 2 remodel. It will take approximately three weeks to demo, which then we will begin grinding off the existing epoxy flooring, building all new CMU walls and eventually HVAC and electrical.

We did some sight work in the

fall of last year, but will continue with the rest of the site work at the end of this month. We have a lot of obstacles to work around with the paving inside the fences so we must coordinate our work to a T.

Ibrahim Ali will be the new Field Engineer on the remainder of this project due to my departure to the Brookings County Detention Center Expansion and Remodel project.



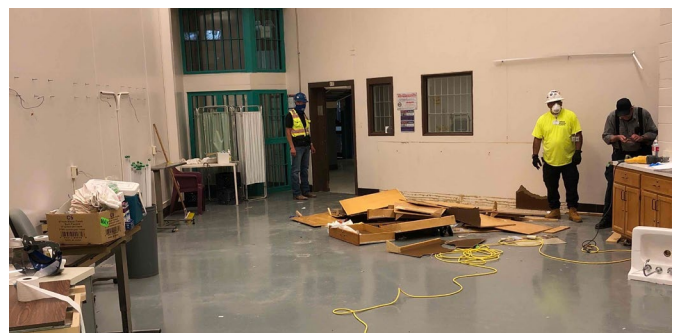

Henry Carlson Construction employees and to our sub-contractors as a reminder to pay attention to risk while working.

We held our second "Be Relentless" Safety Lunch at our Sanford Health Van Demark project on May 12. Field Engineer JD Bechina helped President Jerry Fromm at the grill again!

We had over 100 people gather for lunch, including our office and shop employees, Sanford building facilities employees and our subcontractors on the job.
